What a difference a few months can make. We are now at war with an invisible foe. The fact that it can't be seen and that thankfully few of us have yet to suffer first hand tragedy as a result of this virus makes it difficult to accept the reality and gravity of the situation. Many are still in denial but as we watch the numbers grow day by day, most understand that it is vital that we <u>all</u> do what we can to slow this pandemic down. What is being asked of us – physical distancing, self-isolation, extra hygiene – are small sacrifices to make to protect ourselves, our friends, our families and loved ones. Let's avoid the coulda, woulda, shouldas.

Though most White Sands residents appear to be complying, we have witnessed instances where these practices are being ignored and you know who you are. Without a test, the only way you can know for certain that you are virus free is if you have not left your house or had contact with anyone or anything from the outside for two weeks. Those of us who have returned from traveling outside of Canada have been asked to remain inside our property for two weeks. Everyone should remember to ensure you properly clean those supplies when they come into your house and then clean your hands.

This is what your council has done to assist with reducing the opportunities for this virus to spread within our Village:

- Removed the door from the dumpster compound (high touch item).
- Closed the "Give and Take" and bottle depot (Some highly intelligent (?) person subsequently broke into the Give and Take).
- Closed all recreational areas such as the tennis court, playgrounds and Jack's pond.
- Cancelled all Hall activities and closed the hall and storage shed.
